Developed in 2024 as part of the Erasmus+ project Qualification Makes the Difference! with partners from 9 EU countries, the curriculum reflects diverse European contexts. It incorporates insights from interviews with adult children of parents with addiction issues and the parents themselves. In this way, the curriculum meets the real needs of families impacted by addiction.

Addiction affects the whole family – this curriculum equips trainers to empower professionals to make a real difference.

Who should be trained?
